E-Ballot: May 24th to June 27th 2017

ANNOUNCEMENT

The 2017 EurOMA Elections for six Board Members will be conducted by electronic ballot so that the entire membership is able to vote. Results will be announced at the 2017 EurOMA AGM on July 4th in Edinburgh, UK.

- ⇒ **Six Board Members** will be elected whose mandates will be to serve on the EurOMA Board for a three-year term (2017-2020).
- ⇒ **The terms of office** begin immediately following the 2017 AGM.
- ⇒ **Election** is by a simple majority of the votes.
- ⇒ **Voting Members** are defined as fully-subscribed members of EurOMA for the calendar years 2016 and/or 2017.

There are eight (8) candidates for six (6) Board Member positions.

Nuran Acur

Senior Lecturer

Brief Biography

Nuran Acur has held Associate Professor positions in Innovation and Operations Strategy Management at Ozyegin University (Turkey) and the University of Strathclyde (UK), Assistant Professorial positions at Bilkent University (Turkey), Aalborg University (Denmark), as well as visiting scholarship positions at the Sloan School of Management (USA), London Business School (UK) and Trinity College Dublin (Ireland).

Nuran has published award winning, theory-driven, policy- and practice-relevant articles across the fields of digital innovation, open innovation, product innovation and operations strategy. Nuran's research has appeared in leading journals such as the Journal of Product Innovation Management, International journal of Operations Management, Production Planning and Control, Creativity and Innovation Management and European Management Research. Nuran's work has resulted in winning several awards, such as the 'Most Inspirational Conference Paper Award' by EURAM conference (2016), the 'Highly Commended Paper Award' from the EmeraldLiteratiNetwork, (2005) and the 'EurOMA-POMS Best Conference Paper Award' (2003). Nuran holds positions on the Boards of two respectful academic journals in the innovation field, the Journal of Product Innovation Management and Creativity and Innovation Management. Nuran also serves as referee for a number of OM and innovation journals.

Motivation / Potential Contribution

I am an active member of EurOMA, where I served as a board member of the EurOMA during the 2008-2011 period. I was also on the organizing team of the 14th International Annual EurOMA conference held in Turkey, where I was the programme chair. I believe I have already demonstrated that I can be an effective member of the EurOMA Board and therefore seek election to serve another period. I wish to continue serving our international OM community by developing the innovation management research activities of EurOMA and by strengthening the standing of innovation management as a discipline in an OM.

While I was a member of the EurOMA Board, I organised the conference and extended membership to Turkey and Middle East. I would like to initiate a 'Innovation Management Forum' in the OM community to bring the latest thinking in innovation to the operations field (such as advanced manufacturing, 3D printing, Internet of Things and Industry 4.0), and inspire new avenues for the OM community. I will also be proactive in encouraging increased membership and greater involvement from currently under-represented European countries.



Constantin Blome

Professor of Operations Management,
Lead Management & Organisation,
University of Sussex, UK

Brief Biography

Originally a supply chain consultant, I moved to academia and pursued a European career in research. Since 2013, I am Chair Professor of Operations Management at University of Sussex, UK, overseeing a subject group of 45 faculty members. Prior to that I was the GSK Chair Professor at the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium and assistant professor at the European Business School (EBS), Germany. My most recent research deals with multi-tier supply chains, namely conflict minerals, nurturing innovation in the supply base, and resilience. My track record includes publications in highly-ranked journals, such as IJOPM, JOM, IJPE, JSCM, IJPR, JBE, JBL. Further, I'm associate editor for the JOM and DSJ.

Motivation / Potential Contribution

EurOMA is a truly European success story which I strongly believe in. After having been active in several US led research networks (e.g., AoM, DSI), I feel that EurOMA offers a platform for the creation, exchange, and diffusion of ideas and research outcomes that provides an important alternative to international mainstream discourses. I perceive the EurOMA research community as very international, closely linked to real-world problems (and therefore relevant), and as generally open which allows for a fast adoption of new research domains. As I appreciate these aspects pretty much from a personal stance, I would like to be a facilitator of this success story.

If I was elected to the board, I would first of all endeavour to foster EurOMA's external visibility and the standing of its flagship publication IJOPM. Although EUROMA and IJOPM are well-positioned in the UK, other important communities, such as Germany and France, but also Eastern Europe do not yet recognise EurOMA to its full potential. To rectify this reputational gap, lobbying work and the attraction of further members is required.

Also, I think that the presence of non-Europeans at our conferences is something I would like to work on. I assume this strategy is important in order to grow EurOMA's overall reputation, but also to create further research opportunities for each and every member of the organisation. Hence, I am more than willing to attract scholars from underrepresented regions to our organisation. Last but not least, I would be delighted to help EurOMA extend its doctoral student program, particularly at a more cost competitive level as the doctoral education of our junior researchers is often the Achilles heel of European research. The future of EurOMA depends on attracting junior researchers to our association.



Manda Broekhuis

Brief Biography

Manda Broekhuis is associate professor at the faculty of Economics and Business of the University of Groningen, the Netherlands. She is member of the Operations department in this faculty which is one of the biggest operations department in Europe. She has been EurOMA board member for 3 years now and would love to continue some of the projects that were started during her first term.

Her research focuses on the development and implementation of operations management concepts, such as service modularity, that are on the boundaries of operations and organization science. Main focus in all her research is coordination, i.e., coordination within service supply chains and service triads, between parts in (service)supply, between shifts, and between workers. She publishes in and reviews for journals in both the field of organization science and operations management.

She is program director of two successful and highly appreciated master programs, Master Supply Chain Management and Master Technology and Operations Management. She lectures in the field of service operations, process improvement and healthcare operations.

Motivation / Potential Contribution

From the EurOMA conference in Gotheborg onwards, I and other staff members from the University of Groningen have participated in EurOMA. I love the informal atmosphere and the mixture of papers presented: working papers and more elaborated papers, empirical and conceptual papers, case and survey studies.

The reason to stand for election is that I would like to contribute to the development of the operations society and to contribute to an organisation that facilitates and initiates such nice events. I think that as EurOMA board we should be very open to and continuously interact with the EurOMA community, and support this community in every way. Further, I would like to continue with creating open, supportive and constructive platforms for discussing and exchanging research in the operations management domain.

Another reason is that I would like to contribute to the development of a rigorous research agenda in service supply chain management and service operations management. This agenda would serve two purposes: (a) to generate more focus in the research in these two fields which should give this research an enormous quality boost, and (b) to increase the acknowledgement of service operations research as a relevant and value-adding research field.

I have participated in the organizing committee of several national and international conferences held in my University and, nowadays, I am review co-chair of the next European Decision Sciences Institute Conference that will be hold in Granada next June 2017. In addition, last year, I got the position of Associate Dean of Students and Business Relations of the College of Business and Economics at the University of Granada. Finally, since 2008, I am vice-president of a non-profit organization for international cooperation, with volunteerism experiences in Guatemala, Madagascar and Morocco.

Motivation / Potential Contribution

As a young person, I would like to offer all my experience, enthusiasm, and energy to the Association service, contributing to its growth and consolidation in Europe. I enjoy getting involved in new projects and I think that joining the EurOMA board could be a great opportunity to meet and collaborate to new people, as well as combining efforts to learn and innovate.
