Postdoc and Lecturer
Chair of Production and Operations Management (POM), ETH Zurich, Switzerland

Brief biography

I am a postdoc and lecturer at the Chair of Production and Operations Management (POM) at the Department of Management, Technology, and Economics (D-MTEC) at ETH Zurich, Switzerland. I completed my doctoral study empirically researching drones in manufacturing industries. I studied in Iran (B.Sc.), Italy (M.Sc.) and during my doctoral studies, I conducted my research visit at the University of Bath School of Management, the UK. My research mainly focuses on the management of emerging technologies in manufacturing environments. I have recently published a paper in Journal of Operations Management entitled "Emerging technologies and the use case: A multi-year study of drone adoption" co-authored by Torbjørn Netland and Michael Lewis. To date, I have supervised 24 master thesis projects and am the second advisor of two doctoral candidates at ETH Zurich. I have been also reviewing for journals such as International Journal of Operations and Production Management and Journal of Manufacturing Technology Management.

Motivation/potential contribution

I have attended six EurOMA conferences so far as well as EurOMA Doctoral Seminar, Summer School, Publishing Workshop, and Early Career Workshop. I have learned and developed my career from the inputs I received from the EurOMA community, and I believe I can contribute to the ongoing activities in EurOMA as well as bringing new ideas to further expand EurOMA's offerings. It is an honor to serve such a community that builds upon years of its past members' vast experience and dedication, which has provided me and many other young researchers inspirations to grow, improve, and leave a positive mark.

First, I would like to be the voice and represent operations and supply chain management young scholars' needs and new ideas in the EurOMA board. Second, I would like to strengthen EurOMA's community role in enhancing emerging technology management scholarship and encouraging multidisciplinary research approaches. Third, I would like to contribute to the organization of EurOMA conferences and summer schools, for instance, by offering a new workshop for early-year doctoral students to enhance the theorizing process in operations management research. Elcio Mendonça Tachizawa Associate Professor Polytechnic University of Madrid

Brief Biography

My name is Elcio Mendonça Tachizawa. I am currently an Associate Professor at the Polytechnic University of Madrid. Being born in Brazil, I have developed most of my academic career in Spain, where I established a solid record of scientific publications in top-tier journals in the field of Supply Chain Management (IJOPM, JSCM, JPSM, IJPR, IJPE, SCMIJ). Also, I earned several research in teaching awards in the OM field (e.g. "Nigel Slack" Teaching Innovation Award (EurOMA), Emerald Literati Network Awards for Excellence "Outstanding paper", Emerald Literati Network Awards for Excellence "Highly commended paper" (Emerald Publishing), "Premio CEL Universidad" (Spanish Logistics Association).

Motivation/potential contribution

The contribution I would hope to make to EurOMA if elected is to focus on teaching innovation. I believe this area has an immense growth potential for EurOMA. Since the last pandemic, there has been a radical, disruptive change in the area of Education, with new challenges and new players in the field of higher education (e.g. Amazon Web Services, Khan Academy, LinkedIn Learning, etc) and new technologies (e.g. MOOC, ChatGPT). However, rather than taking this a threat, and I believe we as academics have to take this as a huge opportunity to reinvent our teaching methodologies and adapt ourselves to this new challenging scenario. I am confident I could contribute to EurOMA significantly in this crucial area, with new teaching methodologies such as micro case studies, gamification, AI, virtual reality, hybrid classrooms. I believe such efforts are key for assuring the survival of the OM academic profession in the future.

The main reason I wish to stand for election is to give back some of the opportunities of growth proportioned by EurOMA that have been crucial in the development of my academic career. I have presented my research in several editions of EurOMA conference since 2005 (in the early years of my PhD program), participated in the scientific committee to the EurOMA conference, Young Scholars workshop, chaired sessions, etc. Therefore, I am able to recognize the importance of the association for each of the stages in the academic career of EurOMA members and their respective needs.



Aline Seepma
Assistant Professor at Department of Operations
Faculty of Economics and Business, University of Groningen

Brief Biography

I am an Assistant Professor at the Department of Operations, Faculty of Economics and Business, University of Groningen. I completed my PhD on 'Just Integrating or Integrating Justice' in 2020. I happily commit to teaching courses in the MSc. Supply Chain Management, including Case Study Research and Purchasing. Additionally, I supervise MSc. thesis students on projects related to my research, which explores supply chain management thinking in the public domain.

I am passionate about my current research on justice, youth care and debt counselling supply chains. These chains deliver services with good intentions. Still, citizens continuously experience long waiting times, scarce availability of resources, and increased throughput times. I intend to generate insights, principles, and methods for supply chains that have a public aim, with the goal of boosting the understanding of public service supply chains and diminishing challenges for public organizations, alleviating burdens for citizens and society.

My work has been published in several journals, including the Journal of Supply Chain Management, Supply Chain Management: an International Journal, and Journal of Strategic Information Systems. I received appreciation for my work, e.g., through the 2020 Best PhD Thesis Award (FEB, UoG) and 2021 JSCM Best Paper Award. In addition, I am an editorial reviewer for the Journal of Supply Chain Management as a member of the reviewer development program.

Motivation/ Potential Contribution

The first EurOMA conference that I attended was in 2014 and ever since I joined the conference yearly with great excitement. The doctoral seminars and publishing workshops, combined with the recognition of my work (2015 Best Student Paper Award) were very valuable as part of my personal development towards the scholar that I am now. I happily contributed to the EurOMA conferences across the years via chairing sessions and organizing a special track. I made many valuable connections, made friends and started research projects. I am excited to be part of EurOMA's warm and welcoming community and I wish such outcomes for all (new) members. I am thrilled at the prospect of increasing my contribution as a member of the board. I am eager to (1) support community building related activities that promote learning and networking and potentially result in new research opportunities; (2) support organizing activities that foster both scientific and societal impact; (3) establishing research activities/fora that focus on new or neglected contexts, e.g., settings that increasingly must choose societal impact over costs members in continue developing and nurturing the association by supporting the organization of research related events, contributing to their diffusion and communication as well as promoting new initiatives related, for instance, to teaching operations.

Brief biography

I am employed as Associate Professor of Operations Management at the Department of Management Science, Lancaster University Management School. My research has contributed towards a better understanding of inter-organisational contracting in supply chains and influenced decision-making in practitioner and policy circles alike. I am currently also an Associate Editor of the International Journal of Operations and Production Management. I am also the Academic Director of the Master in Management Science at Solvay Brussels School, welcoming and supporting each year around 300 students from all over the world. I have served on the EurOMA board from 2020 to 2023, participating in the strategic initiatives team and the conferences organizing team.

Motivation / Potential Contribution
